UNDERSTANDING JOHN'S WRITING

The tone and length of 3 John Is more like a series of texts to a friend than a letter to a church. Most of it is spent talking to or about two men. One is a great example of living out the truths John has talked about in his other two letters. The other gives a very real example of what happens when a believer refuses to listen to God's word.

GAIUS (3 JOHN 1-8)

How does John greet Gaius? What do we learn about their relationship? (3 John 1-4)

What does John commend Gaius for (3 John 3-6)?

How does John describe "the brothers", their situation, and what they were sent to do (3 John 5-8)?

DIOTREPHES (3 JOHN 9-10)

What charges does John have against Diotrephes?

At the heart of Diotrephes' attitude, what does he appear to be most concerned with? Not concerned with? (3 John 9-10)

In what situations are you most likely to fall into a "me first" attitude like Diotrephes?

CLOSING WORDS (JOHN 11-14)

John describes Demetrius as "well spoken of by everyone". After this study of John's letters how would you want others to describe your faith and life?

APPLY

In choosing close friends (like Gaius was to John), what do you look for? How can you be that kind of friend to others?

What opportunities do you have to extend hospitality to someone who needs it? At church? In your family? With co-workers? Neighbors? How will you respond?

CHALLENGE

What is one way you want you faith or life to be different because of 1,2,3 John? What will you do about it this week?
