DAILY BIBLE READING AND SOAP STUDY

God has given us the Bible as a primary tool for our spiritual growth. Studying the Bible is more than just gaining information. The Bible is alive and we grow into the likeness of Jesus when we spend time hearing from God and responding to Him. Whether you are new to reading the Bible or have studied it often for many years, the SOAP study method is a simple, yet powerful tool to guide you into deeper understanding and life application.

If the SOAP method is new to you, here is some information to help you get started this week. SOAP stands for Scripture, Observation, Application, Prayer. We have designed SOAP study pages and growth binders to help you make Bible reading and application a part of your daily life. Come to the Connect Center or Purpose Store in the lobby to see if these materials would be helpful to you. 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SCRIPTURE

0	OBSERVATION As you look at the verse you wrote down, consider the context and make some observations: What is going on in this passage? Who are the people in this passage? What comes before and after this verse? What is the background or setting for this verse? How do these observations help you understand this verse?
A	APPLICATION How does it apply to your life right now? Where is it challenging you? How does it encourage you? How will your life be different as you live out this verse? Be specific.
P	PRAYER Ask Jesus, "In light of this verse, what would you have me do, confess, or give thanks for?" Write out your prayer.
