General Information

- Clubbers will not be allowed to leave the church campus for any reason during Club time.
- All Clubbers must have an updated Registration form on file.
- Please encourage Clubbers to use the restroom prior to Club. If Clubbers need to use the restroom during Club, Clubbers must **ask permission**.
- Clubbers should bring handbook and Bible each week.
- Uniforms are required and should be worn each week.
- Clubbers should wear closed-toed shoes each week.
- Appropriate, modest clothing should be worn.
- Please leave hats, toys, food, gum, candy, and money at home.
- All electronics, including cell phones, must be kept out of sight or given to a Leader to hold or put in the classroom “Treasure Box.”
- Clubbers must be respectful—to God, to others, to our facility. This includes appropriate behavior—no bad or hurtful language, no hitting, etc.
- Disrespectful or inappropriate behavior will be addressed using “The Three Count” according to AWANA guidelines as explained on the right.

AWANA Pledge

The Three Count

Key Principles

What is the three count?

1. The three count is a series of discipline steps.
2. It is for the individual discipline of a child, not a group.
3. It is positive discipline, not negative punishment.
4. It seeks to guide and direct children for their benefit.

How is the Three Count performed?

One count: Give the child a specific warning that his or her behavior is not appropriate, and s/he has been warned enough times. Tell the child, “That is a one-count.” It is important for Leaders to discern between the common redirection and guidance given to many children, and the need for assertive discipline steps for a specific child. If a Leader is not sure, the leader must consult the Director.

Two count: After another misbehavior, tell the child, “That is a two-count.” Ask your Director or Commander to meet with the child and you to discuss the problem behavior and the consequences. Remember, this is a conference with the child and two adults. In the conference with the child, her/his positive behavior will be affirmed, however everyone must always show respectful behavior.

Three count: After another misbehavior, tell the child, “That is a three count.” The Director or Commander will remove the child from the activity and take her/him aside. The Director or Commander will speak to the child’s parents, with the child present, to explore together how the child can avoid being disruptive. Emphasize that the child is welcome in club as long as s/he is respectful of the rules. The Director or Commander may consider asking the child to stay home for a week or until the child is ready to be a part of the group.
