#### REFLECT | DISCUSS | PRACTICE

- **1. REFLECT:** How did God specifically speak to you through the Bible passages and sermon?
- 2. DISCUSS: In seasons of pain or lament, what tends to make pursuing God feel harder? If this hasn't been your experience, in what ways have you witnessed God's presence or faithfulness during a time when you walked through a valley and cried out to Him?
- **3. DISCUSS:** Refer to John 11. How does the story of Jesus's response to the death of Lazarus change the way you would approach lament?
- **4. DISCUSS:** Share a time of your life when you were in a phase of orientation, disorientation, and reorientation. What helped you when you went through each phase?
- **5. DISCUSS:** Read Revelation 21:3-4. How does the promise that God will wipe away every tear, and that there will be no more death, mourning, crying, or pain, bring you comfort in your current situations?
- **6. PRACTICE:** What is one way you can slow down this week to spend time with the Lord? If you're in a season of lament, who can you invite to support you? And if you're not lamenting, who do you sense God placing on your heart to encourage this week?"
